Tips for Understanding Scripture

✓ Begin with prayer

Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you as you read and interpret Scripture.

✓ Read carefully & take notes

Often times it is helpful to find a Bible translation that is easy for you to understand as well.

✓ Ask good questions

- O What do I learn about God?
- O What do I learn about people?
- O What is God asking me to do?

What to do with difficult passages...

✓ Use Scripture to interpret Scripture

Interpret difficult passages with clear passages. When in doubt, lean on what you know about the character of Jesus and give priority to New Testament passages.

√ Always seek the author's intended meaning

✓ Avoid basing a belief or conviction on one obscure passage

Try not to accept someone's teaching based on one or two verses without knowing the context.

✓ Seek to understand the context of the passage

Context is what **surrounds the passage**. Avoid taking a Scripture out of its context to make it say what you want it to say.

- Seek answers from within the passage.
- O Seek answers from the immediate context.

These are passages proceeding and following the passage you are studying.

Seek answers from the larger context.

The book in which the passage occurs.

Seek answers from the <u>historical context</u>

What was happening at the time of writing: socially, politically, religiously, etc.

Seek answers from the cultural context.

The cultural values and customs at the time which could have influenced what the author said, why he said it, and how he said it.

Seek answers by <u>comparing similar</u> passages within the Bible.

Passages outside of the book can provide useful information, especially passages with the **same event** or **same topic** as the one you are studying.

Seek answers by consulting <u>secondary sources.</u>

Sources outside of the Bible such as a Bible commentary, a dictionary can be helpful, but try these other things first.
